February GAW Meeting—Looking Ahead

At our February meeting Tod Raines will demonstrate how to make an oval box. This project creates an oval box by laying out an oval pattern based on a rectangular block of wood. I will share the layout and turn on three center points to create the basic shape. A little non-turning work to finish up the shaping. Two chuck mounting points are utilized for creating the bottom and the hollowing. Finally, to add a bit of drama to the form a hook tool is used to create the sloped rim detail. Note – the sphere turning is not part of this demo.

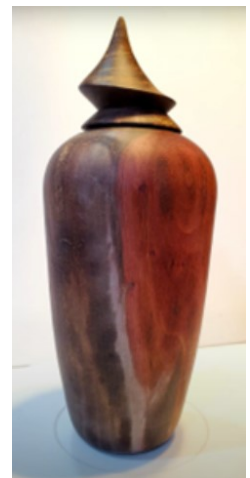
